
Asexual reproduction

Asexual reproduction is a type of reproduction without fertilization from a single plant

There are several sorts of reproduction, the main ones are:

- from creeping stems
- from bulbs
- from tubers
- from rhizomes



The lily of the valley reproduces underground, from horizontal creeping stems:


rhizomes.

On the rhizomes, buds form which will give flowering shoots.

Then, they will form new stems surrounded by leaves that will grow and form a new lily of the valley

Strawberries reproduce naturally from stolons, which are aerial stems that grow from the mother plant and get rooted at the nodes to give new plants
