








Dianthus nardiformis



Dianthus nardiformis is a rare plant belonging to the Caryophyllaceae (Pinks Family), and only grows in the Romanian Carpathians, being adapted to the mountains' rocky calcareous terrain. It is a perennial that can reach heights of 10–20 cm, and it can withstand severe drought.



The plant features numerous small stems with only about two pairs of stretched leaves at the top. The leaves accompany the plant's pale purplish-pink stellate flower that spans around 20 mm in diameter. The petals are toothed at the tip and hairy towards the base. This species of carnation blossoms during late summer.
