


INTRODUCTION





IGA, FROM POLAND

IN MY OPINION DURING OUR STAY HERE I AM ABLE TO SEE SOME DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE POLISH EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM AND THE SPANISH ONE. I CAN SAY THAT THERE WERE THINGS THAT SURPRISED ME A LOT, BUT THERE WERE ALSO ONES, THAT SEEMED QUITE NORMAL. BUT FOR ME THE POLISH SYSTEM IS CLOSER TO MY PERSONALITY THAN THE SPANISH ONE, AND IF HAVE TO DECIDE WHERE I PREFER TO STUDY, MY CHOICE WILL GO TO POLAND.

KINGA, FROM POLAND:

BY THIS TIME I COULD WATCH HOW SPANISH EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM WORKS. I HAVE SEEN STUDENTS' POINT OF VIEW ABOUT TEACHERS AND STUDYING. NOW I CAN SEE ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES OF POLISH SYSTEM. BUT TO BE HONEST IF I COULD CHOOSE COUNTRY, WHERE I NEED TO STUDY, I WOULD CHOOSE POLAND.

BARTOSZ, FROM POLAND:

FOR THESE TWO MONTHS I HAVE SEEN MANY DIFFERENCES BEETWEN POLISH AND SPANISH SYSTEM OF EDUCATION. THE MAIN DIFFERENCE FOR ME ARE LONGER CLASSES AND ONLY ONE BREAK PER SCHOOL DAY. THE THING THAT SUPRISED ME VERY MUCH IS THE LEVEL OF NOISE IN SPANISH CLASSES. IF I HAD A CHOICE WHERE TO STUDY, I WOULD CHOOSE POLAND.

ELLA, FROM FINLAND:

THE SCHOOL RECEIVED US REALLY WELL AS A PART OF THEIR DAILY COMMUNITY, WHICH MADE US FEEL REALLY WELCOME TO THE SPANISH SCHOOL SOCIETY AND ALSO EAGER TO PARTICIPATE IN ACTIVITIES AND LESSONS.

THERE ARE A LOT OF DIFFERENCES BETWEEN FINNISH AND SPANISH SCHOOL SYSTEM. THE BIGGEST DIFFERENCE IS THAT IN SPAIN THERE ARE JUST TWO MAIN PATHS IN STUDIES: ART OR SCIENCE, AND DEPENDING ON YOUR CHOICE YOU STUDY THE SUBJECTS THAT ARE INCLUDED IN THAT SYSTEM. IN FINLAND YOU CAN STUDY FREELY SUBJECTS THAT YOU WANT TO.

ERIKA, FROM FINLAND:

P.E. TEACHING BETWEEN FINNISH AND SPANISH SCHOOLS ARE TOTALLY DIFFERENT. IN FINLAND BOYS AND GIRLS HAVE THEIR OWN LESSONS AND IN SPAIN EVERYONE HAS THE SAME LESSON. IN FINLAND WE PRACTISE MULTIPLE DIFFERENT SPORTS AND HERE IN SPAIN THEY CONCENTRATE MORE ON CERTAIN SPORTS, LIKE VOLLEYBALL AND DANCING.

•FINALLY, EVEN FINNISH AND SPANISH SCHOOL SYSTEMS ARE TOTALLY DIFFERENT, I HAVE ENJOYED MY TIME HERE AND I WILL DEFINITELY COME BACK TO SPAIN SOME DAY.

HENNA, FROM FINLAND:

The Finnish and Spanish school systems have a lot of differences. In Finland, the freedom of choice is underlined in every part but in Spain there are not so many possibilities. There are more responsibilities for students in Finland, we ourselves take care of our studies. Also in Finland we have exam weeks - we study about 2 months and then we have the exams on our subjects. As for students, I have noticed that the Spanish students are more active during classes. The Spanish school, the teachers and the students welcomed us warmly as a part of their community.

ABEL, FROM SPAIN:

I think that there are a lot of differences between Spain and Finland: the school, the food, the habits, the timetable to eat or the different activities that you can do there.

I am so proud of myself because I managed to do this exchange altough I have never been in another country. Now I have another family in Finland.

I used the sauna and it was nice, and went to the lake. It was a nice experience.

Eating new food was the best, because I was tasting things that I am not going to eat again if I dont go to Finland again.

I will repeat this experience if Henna stays with me, or I will travel with her to another country.

SERGIO, FROM SPAIN:

From my point of view, it was a great experience because I could learn the Finnish culture which is totally different from ours. Moreover, I have seen how the educational system works, I have to say that I was really surprised about that. In fact, I would like to have this educational system in Spain.

To sum up, my experience in Finland was awesome, I really like everything from there (nature, people, school...) Moreover, I would repeat the experience whenever I could.

JAVIER, FROM SPAIN:

From my point of view this experience was one of the best experiences that I have ever had in my life. During this experience I have improved my level of English and my personality has changed in many ways. This was the second time I had visited Finland so now I know many things about Finland.

In Finland we did many things in the highschool, especially in PE classes and outside. I loved the PE classes because I did many new sports. The school in general was amazing, and I got surprised with the educational system of Finland. I think that the worst part of Finland was the food. To sum up I think that this experience was a change in my life

DANIEL, FROM SPAIN:

When I only lived in one country I used to think all education systems were the same in the majority of aspects. But I have changed my mind a lot since I was in *Poland*. In Poland the education system is more open to choices for the students. They have different levels for each subject and that is very good because not all students are the same. Everyone is different and it is good to learn according to your capacity. Some of the Polish students were in something called "sport-class", where they can train volleyball in the school without some specific subjects. I like that because students are educated for their own future.

I apreciate the respect that the students have for the teachers. People are more quiet and they show they care about their future.

But I also take into account that Spanish teachers are more interactive and I can feel that I am not only inside a classroom. I am learning.

MARÍA, FROM SPAIN:

It has been great to be in a Polish highschool because there I had the opportunity to see how the Polish Education System works. I must say that it was quite good. The lessons were only with a few students and all of them were quiet. They did not see education as a boring thing, they saw education as an opportunity.

Another thing I really liked was that they could retake their test if they failed it or if they wanted a better mark.

But, what I liked the most was that their lessons lasted 45 minutes and then there was a 10-minute break between lessons. In the middle of the school day there was a 20- minute break. I think that the school timetable is wonderful because students can rest after every lesson. The bad side about it is that some days they have to be at school from 8:00 until 15:00

ANDREA, FROM SPAIN:

My experience in Poland was great, and I will always remember it as a good thing. Moreover, I had the chance to see their educational system, which was quite good. What I like the most about the education in Poland is that everyone appreciates going to school, and they want to do their best in their lessons.

Moreover, they have a nice timetable, because their lessons are 45 minutes long and they have a 10-minute break after each lesson so they can rest and prepare for the next one. Also, they can repeat their exams if they have not done well and I think this is perfect because we all have bad days and sometimes we do not get the results we want.

To end up, I will also say that one thing that I really liked about their educational system is that they have multiple choices in their subjects and they have different levels of difficulty in each subject. For example, there are 6 levels of English and the students just have to take a test to know in which level they choose.



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
