The Story

Next to the apse of the Cathedral, the Ghirlandina tower, symbol of the city of Modena, projects upwards with its 89.32 meters, agile and slender, in its harmonious proportions.

Built as a bell tower of the Cathedral, the Ghirlandina has held an important civic function since its origins: the sound of its bells has marked the times of life of the city, reported the opening of the gates of the walls and summoned the population in situations of alarm and danger.


