

Getting to Know You Bingo

Bingo

- 1. Provide time for students to get to know their class mates by completing a Bingo Sheet with a Characteristic or Experience in each Box. The Bingo sheet can be adapted to meet the characteristics of any group.
- 2. Students introduce themselves to classmates and ask if they have the characteristic or have had an experience noted in the Bingo Box.
- 3. If the student asked about the characteristic answers yes, then the classmate writes their name in the box and moves on to meet another classmate.
- 4. Students continue until all of the boxes are complete for a row, column, diagonal or 4 corners.
- 5. When a student has one of the above complete they shout out Bingo.
- 6. The instructor goes and confirms the answers, so that all students in the class learn about the students in the winning row.
- 7. This can be continued until the Bingo Boards are blacked out.
- 1. This activity can be adapted to meet the time constraints of the class.
