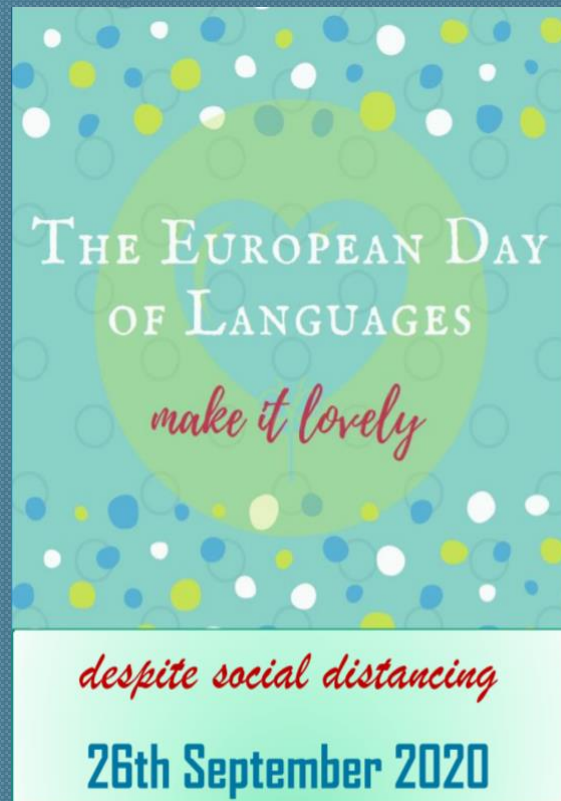


# THE EUROPEAN DAY OF LANGUAGES 2020



# Introduction

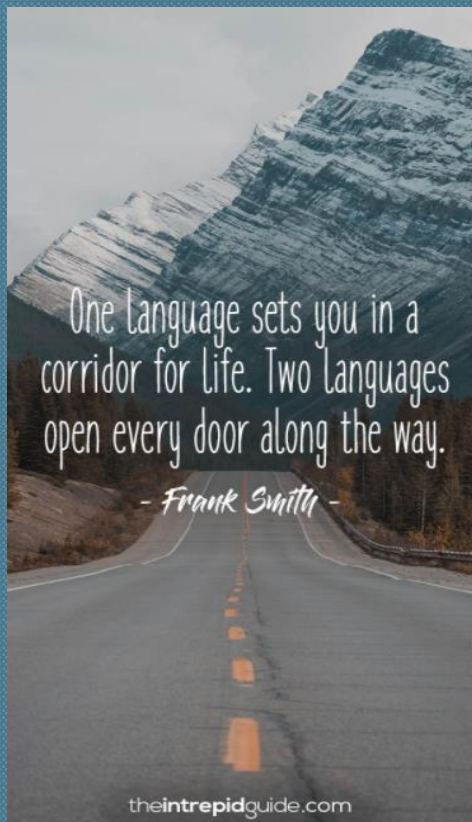
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- ⦿ This year, The European Day of Languages was celebrated by our students with the same enthusiasm of previous years, but with a few safety precautions and some social distancing.

- ⦿ Despite all these restrictions, the students were able to participate in the activities presented and produce interesting work which celebrates the learning of languages, the pleasure of travel, the respect of other cultures and people.

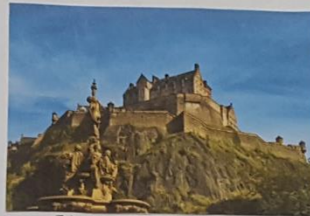


# SCOTLAND

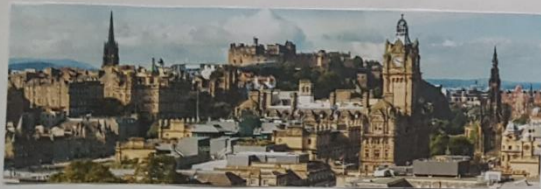
In Scotland speak English but also speak Scottish Gaelic.

## French

### Curiosities

- French is spoken in 56 countries all over the world (it is the official language in 25).
- It was once the official language of England, between the second half of the 11th century and the end of the 14th.
- It is known to be one of the languages with the most seats in the spelling of words.
- One of the most difficult tongue twisters in the world in French: «si six scies scient six cyprès, six cent six scies scient six cent six cyprès» (In English, «if six saws saw six cypresses, six hundred and six saws saw six hundred and six cypresses»).

## Greek

### Curiosities

- Greek is the Indo-European language with the longest and most well-documented history, spanning 34 centuries of written records.
- The Greek alphabet emerged from the Phoenician script, and ended up giving rise, in turn, to the Latin, Cyrillic, Coptic, and several other writing systems.
- Along with Latin, Greek gave rise to several languages nowadays spoken.

### Usual expressions:

"Hello": "Χαίρετε" ("Chairete")  
"Good Morning": "Καλημέρα" ("Kaliméra")  
"Thanks": "ευχαριστώ" ("Efcharistó")  
"Good bye": "αντίο σας" ("Antio sas")  
"Bon appetite": "καλή όρεξη" ("Kali óress")  
"Love you": "Σε αγαπά" ("Se agapó")

## Italian

### Curiosities:

- The Italian alphabet consists of only 21 letters, the letters J, K, W, X, Y not being part of the alphabet, they are only used in foreign words.
- Italian is the official language of Italy, Switzerland, the Vatican, San Marino and the Military Sovereign Order of Malta.
- In Italy, almost all regions have a "regional language", derived from Italian.

"Hello": "Ciao"  
"Good Morning": "Buongiorno"  
"Thanks": "Grazie"  
"Good bye": "Addio"  
"Bon appetite": "Buon appetito"  
"Love you": "Ti amo"

## Norwegian

### Curiosities:

- Norwegian is not just one language, but two: Nynorsk (modern Norwegian and spoken among the population) and Bokmål (the "language of books" in its literal translation, which is learned at school and written).
- Norwegian belongs to the Indo-Germanic language family and is found next to Danish, Icelandic and Swedish the branch of Scandinavian languages.
- The Norwegian language alphabet consists of a derivation of the Latin alphabet with the addition of the symbols: æ, å and ø.

### Usual expressions:

"Hello": "Hallo"  
"Good Morning": "God morgen"  
"Thanks": "Takk skal du ha"  
"Good bye": "Ha det"  
"Bon appetite": "Nyt maten din"  
"Love you": "Jeg elsker deg"

## European Day of languages

- The European Day of languages was proclaimed by the European Commission and the Council of Europe and it was celebrated for the first time on September 26, 2001.
- It was created to celebrate and honor the linguistic diversity existing among the 47 Council of Europe member states, which is distributed by about eight hundred million people, the Europeans; to remember that this linguistic variety is a wealth of the common European heritage and therefore, it must be preserved forever and to promote multilingualism among Europeans.

## Portuguese

### Curiosities:

- Portuguese is the sixth most spoken language in the world.
- Portuguese is the official language of nine countries: Angola, Brazil, Cape Verde, Guinea-Bissau, Equatorial Guinea, Mozambique, Portugal, São Tomé and Príncipe and East Timor.
- Portuguese is the official language of part of China, in Macau.
- Only 5% of people who speak Portuguese reside in Portugal. Of every 5 people who speak Portuguese, 4 are Brazilian, on average.

## Romanian

### Curiosities:

- Romanian is a language spoken by around 28 million people worldwide, mainly in Romania and Moldova, where they are official languages. But the language is also spoken in neighboring countries, such as Ukraine. It is estimated that an additional 8 million people have Romanian as a second language.
- Romanian is the only Romance language (derived from Latin), which prevailed in Eastern Europe.
- The Romanian language is 1,700 years old.

## Spanish

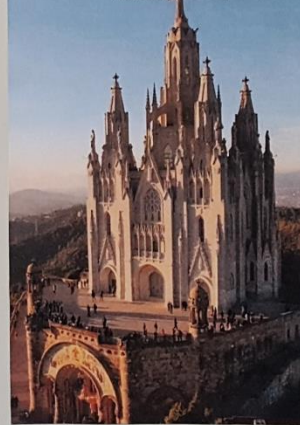
### Curiosities:

- It is the official language in 19 countries, and about 90% of them are on the American continent.
- According to experts, Spanish, no matter how different it is, is the easiest language to learn and pronounce.
- In schools, Spanish is the most sought after language as a second language in Europe and the USA.
