- Journalist, feminist, writer and Europeanist, she lived until ninety years old, long enough to see some of the goals she fought for realized.
- She was an influential voice in French and international politics from the age of 27, until his death in 1983.
- Mostly engaged in the cause of the voting right of the women.



History

(continuation)

- Journalism was a means of "waging war on war" and used writing as a way of expressing its views and promoting peace and equality.
- She led demonstrations demanding that women have the simple right to dispose of their own wages and the right to participate in political and social life.
- Her actions in favor of the vote of women and her elegance in dress are well known.



History

(continuation)

- Louise Weiss ran for office and was elected to the European Parliament in 1979, having delivered the inaugural address at the opening session of the legislature at the age of 86.
- After his death, the main building of the European Parliament in Strasbourg was named after him.
