## 3<sup>rd</sup> Transnational Project Meeting: 03<sup>rd</sup> – 07<sup>th</sup> October 2016 in Brilon /Germany

On Monday, 3<sup>rd</sup> October, 2016, delegations from all participating countries arrived in Brilon/Germany for the 3<sup>rd</sup> transnational project meeting. On Tuesday morning, all German students welcomed the delegations in the schoolyard. During several working sessions the participants discussed a lot how to create the Methodology Guide. At the end we agreed on a common form and on the way to write down the results of our project. We used the workshops also to talk about the second year work plan. Finally we decided how to vote the common logo of our project.



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In the evening we used the schools kitchen to prepare together a very delicious meal.

In order to show the importance of this meeting for the small town of Brilon, the delegations were invited by the mayor in the historical town hall.

In the evening we went for a walk to a small hut in the forest where we enjoyed a typical German meal and of course German beer.

Finally we visited Soest, a historical town with a lot of old houses.

At the end of the meeting all participants left Germany with a lot of new impressions.

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# Logo Competition

During the meeting in Germany we agreed on a deadline to upload the missing logos. From the 15<sup>th</sup> to the 31<sup>st</sup> October all schools had to vote the best logo. Of course you couldn't vote for the logo of your own school. In each school there was a students and a teachers vote.

The results were counted by the Portuguese team and the Croatian votes still missing the Portuguese and the German logo had 6 votes both. So the Croatian voting for Portugal decided the competition. Congratulations to Barbara Gomes who created the winning Portuguese logo.

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## Activities in the schools

### **European Day of Languages**

One of the aims of our European project consist in encouraging our students to think in a European way. To get in contact with students from other nations, foreign languages are very important. The diversity of languages is also a symbol of the diversity of cultures in Europe. So we used the European Day of Languages in order to demonstrate this diversity but also the beauty of European languages.

### <u>Lithuania</u>

On September 26th we celebrated European Day of Languages at Lekeciai school in Lithuania. Our school students prepared an information board about language facts, diversity and simmilarities of European languages. At English lessons students discussed about the importance of learning their mother tongue and different foreign languages in the current world. During the school event students of classes 7-10 had an opportunity to listen to presentations about European languages and the uniqueness of Lithuanian language in Indo-European language family given by teachers Ruta Krikstopaitiene and Violeta Adomaitiene. Students of class 8 have also presented their project work on languages. After all the presentations students were asked to take part in the quiz of European Day of Languages. Finally, all school students were invited to participate in a musical contest of European languages. In the meantime students of class 5 and 6 were also involved in activities of European Day of Languages. Their task was to draw flags of some European countries on the pavement at the front door of the school using colour chalk.









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### <u>Germany</u>

In order to prepare the decoration for the third transnational metting in Brilon, students looked for the word "Welcome" in the different languages. They found the translations on Internet and they drawed the words in the European colors blue and yellow. The most difficult one was the Bulgarian words with Cyrillic letters.
