With the guided visit we learn not only about the hunting and farming but also about the art and architecture.

Moreover, there are a lot of activities, which will let you experience what the people in that time knew how to do: starting a fire, decorating a plate. There are hundreds of things you can learn through several workshops in Arqueopinto.

Prado Museum - Madrid

Prado Museum is one of the most famous picture galleries in the world, If you are in Madrid you must visit it because it holds part of general knowledge and culture. It is located near the Neptune fountain and the Botanical Garden.

Prado Museum collection works of art from the 12th to 19th centuries, masterpieces by Velázquez, Goya and El Greco. But it is not just about paintings, but it also assembles engravings and decorative art pieces. It was the first royal museum. That is the reason why people referred to the museum like the Royal Museum, but in 1920 people started calling Prado, because Prado in English means lawn, and the place where it is collocated was a lawn.

The Museum opens everyday, from Monday to Saturday, from 10:00 to 20:00 and on Sundays and holidays, from 10:00 to 17:00.

The general ticket costs around 15€, the general with the guide around 24€ and it has a reduced price for people over 65, big families and young people with youth cards around 7€. Also there is free admission for students between 18 and 25 years old, and on the 19th of November because of the anniversary of the oraid museum and on the 18th of May because it is the international day of the museums.


Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía - Madrid -

The **Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía** is Spain's national museum of 20th-century art. The museum was opened in 1990, and is named after the former Queen of Spain, Queen Sofía.

It is located in Madrid, near Atocha train station. In the same area as Prado Museum and Museo Thyssen-Bornemisza.

The museum is mainly dedicated to Spanish art and it includes works by painters so important as Pablo Picasso and Salvador Dalí. The most famous masterpiece in the museum is Picasso's 1937 painting *Guernica*.

Apart from a big collection, the museum also offers temporary exhibitions making it one of the world's largest museums for modern and contemporary art.
