

Friday Photo Decoding Photographs



Step I- Describe- Look at the **facts**/what do you see? Add a yellow sticker

- colours
- time of day
- the people
- the landscape
- the shapes
- textures

Step 2- Analyse- ask questions Add a blue sticker

- I. Look at the decisions the photographer made;
 - camera angles
 - lighting
- 2. What draws your eye immediately?
- 3. What is going on in the background?
 - Are there any recognizable buildings or landmarks?
 - What is the overall mood or feeling?
 - Is there any writing in the photograph?

Step 3- Interpret- Use the descriptions and questions to infer what is happening Add an orange sticker

- 1. Use the information you have (description and analysis) to **draw conclusions** about the photograph. Use all the clues and connect them together so they make sense.
- 2. Can you see what exactly is happening in the photograph?
- 3. What is the photographer trying to say? What's the big idea?
 - Why did the photographer choose this angle?
 - What is left out of the photograph?

Step 4- Evaluate- Title the work by synthesizing what you've learned Add a green sticker

- I. What do you think about this work?
- 2. Make a judgment about the value, significance and importance of the photograph.
- 3. What would you title/name the photograph?
