	Jan Amos Komensky (Comenius) was born in Moravia, Czech Republic in 1592.
	He writes many books, such as "The Labyrinth of the World" and "Orbis Sensualium Pictus".
	His teaching methods are innovative: he is an educational reformer.
	He travels a lot; he works as a teacher in London, Elbing (Poland) and Stockholm (Sweden).
	He is a teacher and a priest, a philosopher and an educator.
	The children are happy to learn.
	He returns to Leszno but in 1656 his house is burnt down and he is sent away.
	He moves to Amsterdam, where he dies in 1670.
	In 1621 there is a long war; he moves to Leszno in Poland in 1628.
