The other delegations arrived on Monday, 19 from Poland, Italy and Cyprus at the **Secondary School of Ermesinde**, the meeting point for teachers, students and host families. At our arrival, we were offered different materials related to the project: a timeline of the activities, credentials and some gifts such as a backpack with the school logo, a pencil, a notebook... After finishing the school lessons, all the students went home to have dinner with their host families.

First of all, we attended a reception at the Town Hall, where the town representatives welcomed us to **Ermesinde** and a teacher introduced the Portuguese students, who were going to give us a presentation about the geographical and cultural features of Valongo region. 21st WednesdayNOVEMBER

After the break, the teachers held a meeting to choose **the project logo**, while the students were taking part in a **creative tark** consisting in the construction of the structure of a famous landmark, using gummies and spaghetti. The students were all mixed up in different teams, fostering team work and the respect for individual contributions, as inherent values of our project.





The logo election was made after an explanation of their meaning by the teachers; the coordinators gave their votes and finally, being Portugal and Poland the finalist ones, the Polish logo was elected, and it will represent us throughout this project.



Saint Martin's Fair began after lunch. Our students were really nervous because they had to perform in front of so many people, including students, teachers and families! The school was beautifully decorated, and we could confirm the kindness and warmth of Ermesinde people. Portuguese students and teachers performed two traditional dances and songs, called **Malhão** and **Laurindinha**; Italian students wore traditional costumes and danced **Tarantella**. Later, the Spanish students and her teacher danced **Sevillanas** and the Cypriot students sang a traditional song, **Vaitsivitsello**. Finally, the Polish representatives danced the **Krakowiak** and sang a song called **Przbyli ulani pod okienko**.







When all the performances were finished, it was time to enjoy the wonderful atmosphere created in the school, tasting roast chestnuts, delicious cod puffs, cream tarts and many other traditional Portuguese delicacies, manufactures both by students and families. We could notice the involvement of all the members of the educational community, and the satisfaction in them. We all enjoyed this event and were extremely happy with the final result, so students went home with the host families having done a good job.





22nd Thursday NOVEMBER

Next, we stopped near the Cathedral and could walk around the historic centre of Porto, which has been in the UNESCO World Heritage List since 1996. We also visited São Bento Railway Station, beautifully decorated with the typical blue antique tiles. We continued strolling to the *Avenida dos Aliados*, where we had lunch.













Later, we went on the bus to cross the river to the opposite bank. There, we did a **boat cruise** through the Douro River. We really enjoyed this trip, and it the whole day was an unforgettable cultural tour for both students and teachers.





To finish the day and our meeting, our host country offered us a farewell dinner. We tasted typical Portuguese dishes and our students enjoyed it very much.
