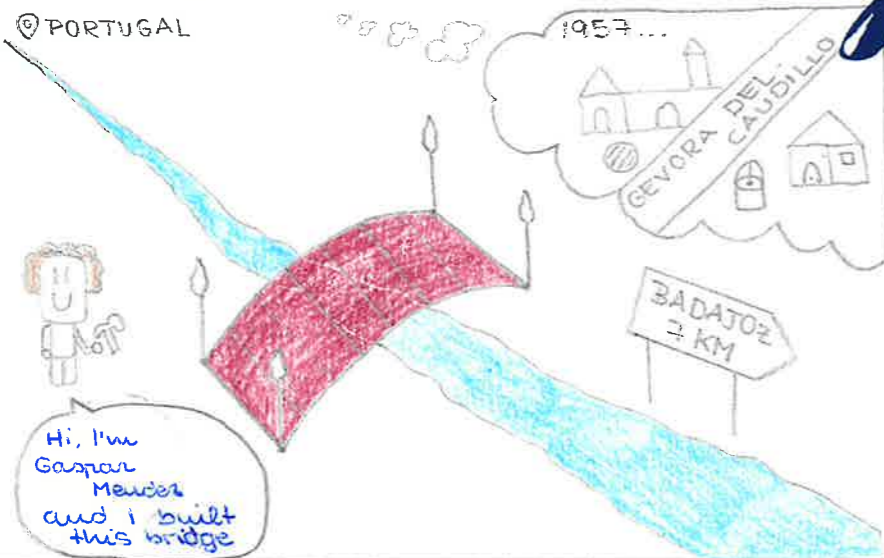

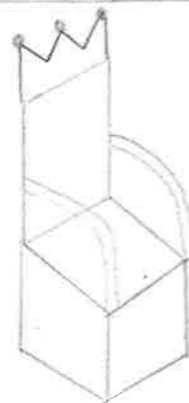


PORTUGAL

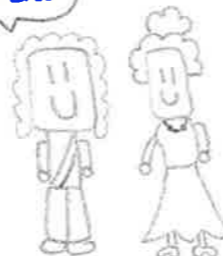

Hi, I'm Philip 2nd



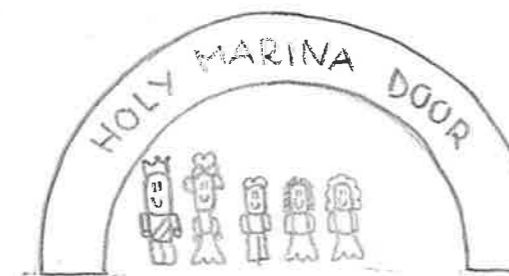
Hi, I'm Marie 1st

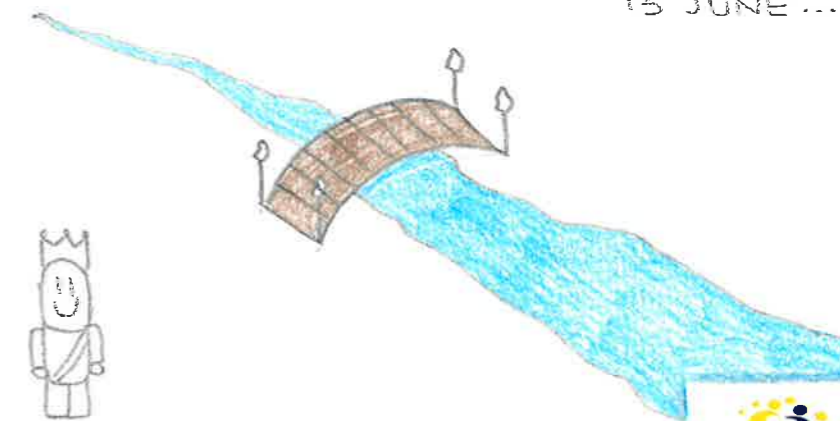


What characterized the thirds were their organizations in tactical units and their combat doctrine, but what made them almost invincible was their firepower

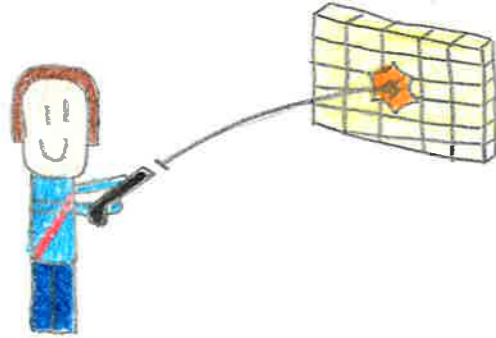
