-Piazza Matteotti (Matteotti's Square) is delimited by beautiful buildings: there's also an important church called «Chiesa del Suffragio»;



-Palazzo Comunale (Town Hall) has a Roman architecture: it's in Piazza Matteotti;

-Biblioteca Comunale (Public Library) was built in 1608, it contains nearly 140.000 volumes;

FESTIVITIES

- Lom a Merz: Literally ‘light in March’, takes place in Spring, to send away the Winter. It’s a very old festivity. In the old days shoots were burnt in fields and people used to dance and sing around the bonfire to welcome spring;
- Santerno’s Agricultural Fair: The fair is dedicated to the agricultural world. Tourists can find agricultural products, agricultural machines and gardening products;
- Sfujareia: The festivity recalls the ancient tradition of ‘peeling off’ cobs’ corns, dances and singings. There are rural culture expositions, live music, gastronomic stands and obviously the cobs’ corns’ ‘peeled off’;
- Baccanale: Every year you can discover different gastronomic ideas on cooking to celebrate the pleasure to sit at the table tasting food and sharing the company of friends. There are also events related to food, shows; Imola is transformed in a great proscenium on which historians, chefs, artists and producers give their contribution to the celebration of food.
