

## MOLECULAR GASTRONOMY IN EUROPEAN PERSPECTIVE

TM Raport

From 6th to 8th November 2017 a transnational meeting was organised in Szkoła Podstawowa z Oddziałami Integracyjnymi nr 214 in Warsaw, Poland. Thep participants were representatives of the granted schools: Borgese-XXVIIMaggio from Italy, Osnovna škola Gornje Vrapče from Croatia and IES VILLA DE ABARÁN from Spain and Szkoła Podstawowa z Oddziałami Integracyjnymi nr 214 from Poland (a hosting counry).

The participants arrived on Monday and had a free afternoon for unpacking and acclimatisation. On Tuesday at 10 am they were welcomed at hosting school and they met with the school staff. The tour around the school was organised by the school students.

Next point of the schedule was a science object lesson at 11 am conducted by Mrs. Wloczewska – a chemistry teacher.



At 12 am the lunch was served.





From 1 pm to 4 pm the whole team was working on the project (discussing project activities, making adjustments to the original project form and the timetable).



The day was ended with the dinner at 4 pm in the school.

On Wednesday trip to The Museum of the Mazovian Countryside in Sierpc was made.





The participants had an unique opportunity to acquaint with Polish folklore and traditional food while eating lunch at 'Pohulanka' tavern in Sierpc and dinner at the "Three Elements" restaurant. After that the project meeting was organised at the Conference Centre.

On Thursday at 10 am the students of Szkoła Podstawowa z Oddziałami Integracyjnyminr 214 showed their own multimedia presentation about traditional Polish cuisine.



At 11 am Mrs. Wloczewska conducted molecular gastronomy workshop. After that, during the coffee break the participants could taste some of products created during the workshop.





From 1 pm to 4 pm the project meeting was taking place (finalizing project decisions, establishing communication protocols).



While working on the project the following subjects were taken into consideration and discussed:

- a) llogistic and financial details concerning students' exchanges;
- b) a schedule of project actions and activities;
- c) dividing responsibilities and duties between country partners;
- d) project impact and dissemination activities;
- e) details concerning the project web page, blog and e-twinning, twinspace;
- f) details concerning the project logo contest;
- g) the procedure of choosing students participating in the project activities;
- setting standards of cooperation and communication and setting the frequency and preferable means of communication;
- i) analyzing potential problems and obstacles;
- j) discussing ways of dealing with potential conflicts.

All the issues above were analysed carefully and thoroughly to be able to reach an agreement among all partner countries. That task seems to be achieved almost completely what the results of TM evaluation suggest.

      - (4) final farewell dinner.
    - b) the arriving children sleep at host students' homes.

- 2) as far as project actions and activities:
  - a) details of before mobility activities such as:
    - (1) multimedia presentations;
    - (2) cooking tasks;
    - (3) molecular cooking tasks;
    - (4) e-conference.
- 3) as far as duties are concerned:
  - a) Poland is responsible for project evaluation:
  - b) Croatia is responsible for project IT issues (web page, Facebook);
  - c) Spain s responsible for photo documentation;
  - d) Italy is responsible for the project dissemination (survey) and project curriculum.
- 4) when it comes to setting standards of cooperation and communication and setting the frequency and preferable means of communication:
  - a) 7 days to respond
  - b) less time you the deadline is requested;
  - c) official forms of communication: emails, eTwinning, TwinSpace
  - d) unofficial forms of communication: WhatsApp, Messenger
- 5) concerning the procedure of choosing students participating in the project activities:
  - a) the final of choosing students: 15th December
  - b) the criteria of choosing students are the same as suggested in the project form
    - Students are at least in their second class to last class so they have the possibility to take part in two-year project till its end.
    - (2) Students' ability to learn science subjects (ability assessment).
    - (3) The level of English.

The last point of the schedule was a farewell dinner at the restaurant "Under the Red Hog" in Warsaw.

On Friday participants had free time for packing and leaving.
