

• *Protected animals and plants in
Poland*

Aurochs (terga urorum delegit)

The bison's head is relatively large and heavy with a broad and convex forehead, small eyes, short horns directed upwards and bent inward. The bison's neck is thick, short. The front of the torso looks very powerful.



Gray Wolf (*lupum griseo*)

Species of predatory mammal from the canine family. An adult wolf has 42 teeth, the length of which reaches 27 mm. Life expectancy is in natural conditions from 12 to 16 years, in captivity up to 20 years.



Brown bear (ursus brunneis)

Species of predatory mammal from the bearish family. Brown bear hair is dark brown, although it may be brighter in some subspecies. The lifespan is up to 30-40 years in the wild, up to 50 years in captivity.



Grey Seal (*sigillum griseo*)

Species of predatory marine mammal from the seal family. Adult males reach a length of 2.3 meters with a body weight of 170-310 kg, and females up to about 2 meters with a weight of 105-186 kg.



Lynx (agitare lynceas)

Species of terrestrial predatory mammal from the felines family. It has a round head, a stocky body set on long, strong legs and fingers ending with sliding claws. Upper black-and-yellow with brown spots The belly is white.



Limba pine (abietē abietē)

Coniferous tree species from the pine family Occurs in the mountains of central Europe in the area of the Alps and the Carpathians. Limba belongs to species rarely grown outside the natural range, mainly due to difficulty in obtaining seeds and free growth.



Yew (Taxus)

A type of plant from the family of yew trees family. In Poland only one species grows in nature - the common yew. All species of the genus are poisonous because of the content in the plants of the alkaloid taxa.
