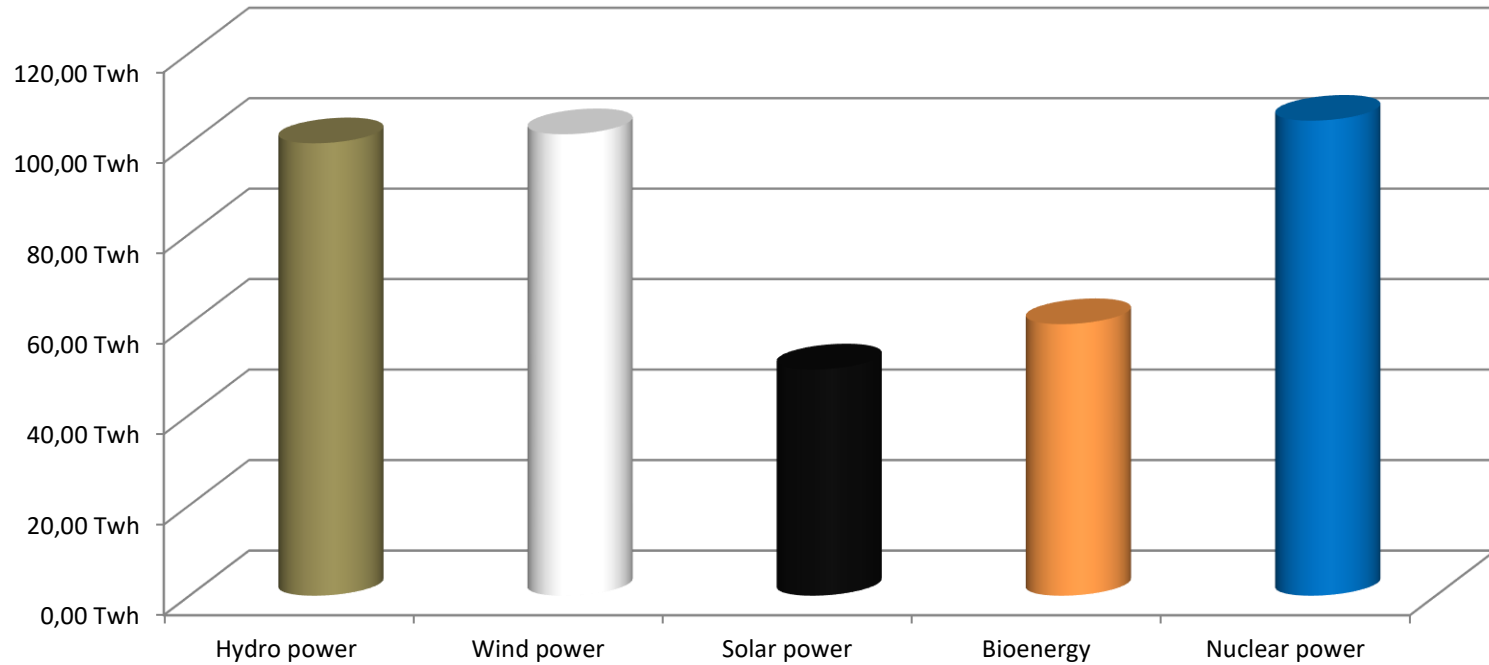

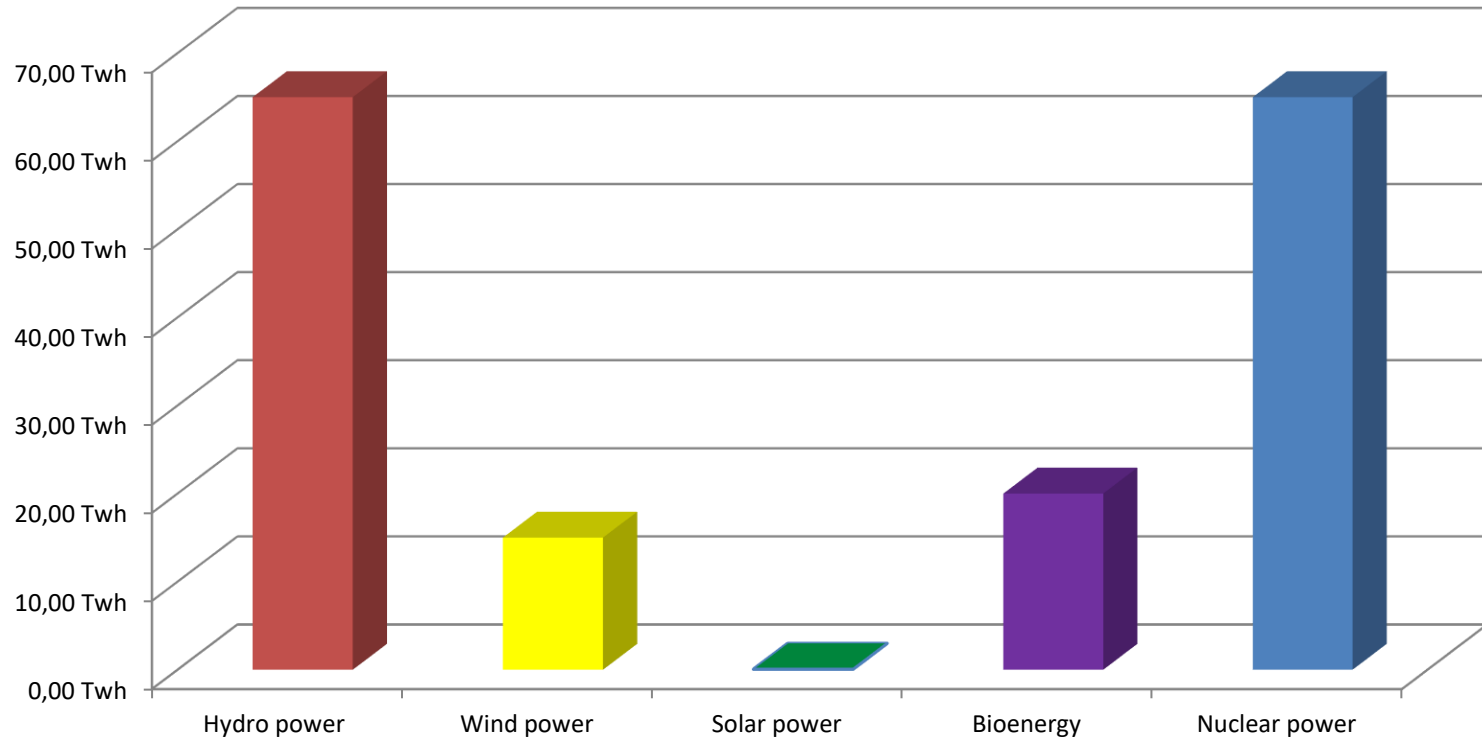
Why is Malmö a green city?

- Sweden is the third country most ecologist of the world with a 90,26% of 100 behind Iceland (90,34%) and Finland (90,68%)
- Sweden has been working 50 years to change from been an industrial city to be a type of ecologic city that all the other city want to seem
- In 2030, all his energy's generation will be generated by renewable energys.

The city has more than 470 km of bicycle paths and the 25% of the country's trips are in bicycle.



There are 10000 square metres of photovoltaic cells along the city and a huge eolic park near to the coast.

In 2020, a new city called Hyllie will be finished and it will have 9000 houses and a lot office blocks. Hyllie is going to be a 100% ecologic city.
