# Rubbish bin

Odense municipality has given all residents two rubbish bins. Each rubbish bin is split in two. The whole point of these, is to teach us how to sort the garbage.

One side is for paper/small cardboard and the other side is for glass/metal



One side is for residual waste and the other side is for food waste.



This is our bin inside the house.  
We throw the biowaste (ec: mostly food) into the bin with the green bag.  
And in the black bin we throw our plastic, wrapping and packaging in.  
The system is very new, and it came this year.  
The bio waste goes into the right side of the big bin and the black bags go to left side of the bin.



# Recycle bottles

When we buy a bottle in Denmark we can often recycle them, and get money for it. The bottles are recycled and getting made in to new bottelse. There is pant A, pant B and pant C.

Pant A = 1 DKK

Pant B = 1,5 DKK

Pant C = 3 DKK

In many supermarkets you can recycle your bottles and get a ticket with the moneys on.
