

**Interview to Marta of Classroom for All Project (Proyecto Aula para Todos), Youth house, Puerto Real, Cádiz.**

In this project there are 14 kids of different races, not immigrants (their parents were the ones who came like immigrants) and other 2 who are immigrants. These students are studying preschool, primary or secondary school in other centers in Puerto Real and in El Puerto de Santa María (near Puerto Real). They are all in the same room when they go to the youth house but they get personalized attention depending on their necessities. These students are mostly moroccans and senegalese but there also are romanians and pakistanis and the most of them (except the ones of preschool) know spanish when they start the classes with the project but they don't have much help at home with vocabulary for example.

There are some voluntary teachers who give the classes (in spanish) and the project have been working for four or five years (every tuesday or tuesdays and thursdays in normal days and depending on the situation). There also are classes of spanish for adults. They are like extracurricular classes, where the kids do the school's homework and prepare exams but they don't do any official exams.

According to subjects, Marta told us that the most difficult one for kids is spanish language and also that they (principally moroccan ones) are very good in maths.

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
