When we think of an immigrant, we usually think of someone who is poor, who has made a lot of sacrifice and spent many difficulties to settle in our country.

Has it been difficult to adapt?


No, I didn't get any difficulties compared with other immigrants. The only problem I had, was to validate my Ireland studies.

I go there once a year and they come to Spain twice a year.




Since you were here, has your personal situation improved?
