

Evaluation of the second mobility (Spain)


On the final day of the mobility the students filled out a survey in which they evaluated the week.




To most of the students the aims of the project are clear. However, the diagram shows that some of the students are still unsure. Before next mobility, teachers should strive to clarify this.




Roughly 85 % of the students thought that the program was interesting and relevant. All in all, we can conclude that the week's agenda was successful.



Most students learned many new things about the topic of the project; others at least some. However, the diagram shows that we can put more emphasis on this in the upcoming mobilities.




The majority of the students found the information received from the teachers helpful; only a few needed more. Before next mobility, we should aim to provide them with even more thorough information.


All of the students found that they could communicate with the other students. This shows the relevance of this particular project and ensures a successful mobility.

My stay with the host family (or hosting a guest student) was comfortable and pleasant. $^{27\,\mathrm{svar}}$





My English was good enough to participate and to carry out project work. $_{\rm 27\;svar}$




All of the students were able to speak English well enough to be part of the project. This is an important building block of the whole project.

The students are clearly competent users of digital technology, and therefore the usage of ICE was not a problem during the project.


I think I will keep in touch with some people I have met here. 27 svar


What I have learnt will have a positive impact on my attitude towards cultural differences and mobility in Europe.




There is a widespread positive attitude towards the EU and other European countries after this project.
