




THE BROWN BEAR – GENERAL FACTS

In western Europe a small number can be found. In the southern part also a small number.

The biggest number (37, 500) can be found between Ural Mountains and the West coast of Finland.

> The second biggest number of brown bears can be found in the Carpathians (Poland, Romania, Ukraine, Slovakia). This means about 8, 100. Romania has the biggest number .(6,300)


> > About 2,800 brown bears live between the East part of the Alps and the Pindus Mountains in Greece.



THE BROWN BEAR IN ROMANIA



In Romania the brown bear can be found all over the Carpathians. The most populated areas are the red ones on the map. Our county, Brasov, is included I these areas.















Romania has the largest bear population in Europe 6, 000 specimens. This means about 60% of Europe's bear population. The brown bear lives along the entire chain of the Carpathians. They prefer the vast and rich forests where they can find quiet areas, not touched by men's presence.

The dumpsters are a permanent temptation for the bears.

Unfortunately, these bears became a tourist attraction.








WHAT IS AN HABITUARY BEAR?

- An habituary bear is a bear that has learnt to accept human presence due to repeated encounters.
- An habituary bear will not avoid **human presence**, although he will keep a certain "safe" distance for protection.
- Their eating habits are changed. They no longer look for food in the woods, instead they prefer "easy food" – household waste and food offered by people in urban areas.









During the last few years, the local authorities together with the Local Forest Authority, realized how serious the problem was and their efforts decreased the number of bears that have evening walks around dumpsters.







Massive deforestation has pushed the animals to the foot of the mountains and towards urban areas where they try to find food.











How can we fix the "Problem"?


Shooting them? That's not a solution.


•We can develop projects with the Hunters' Associations in order to move a part of the bears to areas especially created for them.
