Ján Janský

Prof. MUDr. Ján Janský, lived in Prague was Czech neurologist and psychiatrist. He was the first who described separation of human blood to the four blood groups I, II, III and IV. This division, first delivered in November 1906 by the Association of Czech doctors and later in 1907 he published the "Compendium of clinical" entitled "Hematological studies in psychotics." However, that division was created as a byproduct of his research. Jansky alone is no longer blood research did not address. Designation as blood groups A, B, AB and O were introduced only in the thirties of the 20th century.
