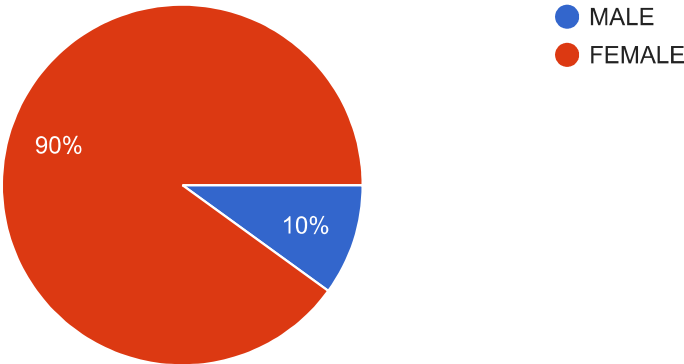

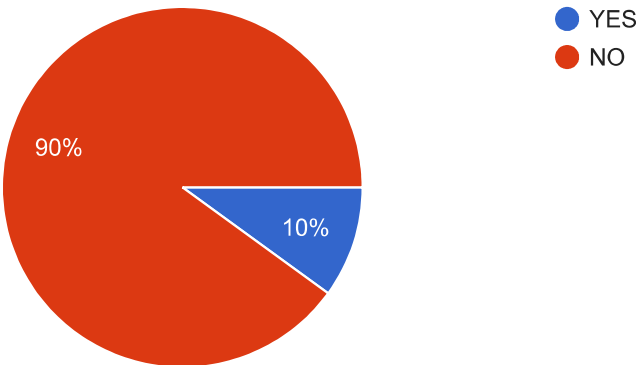

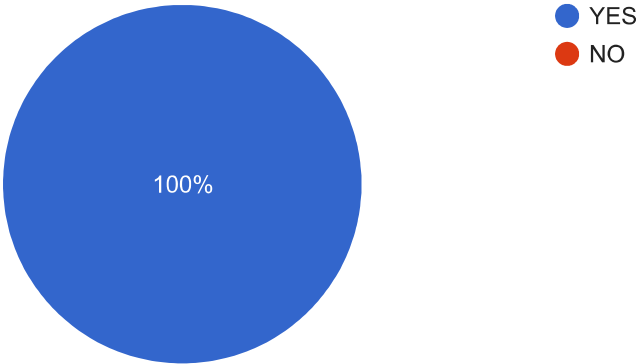
Have you been abroad for the first time thanks to this project?

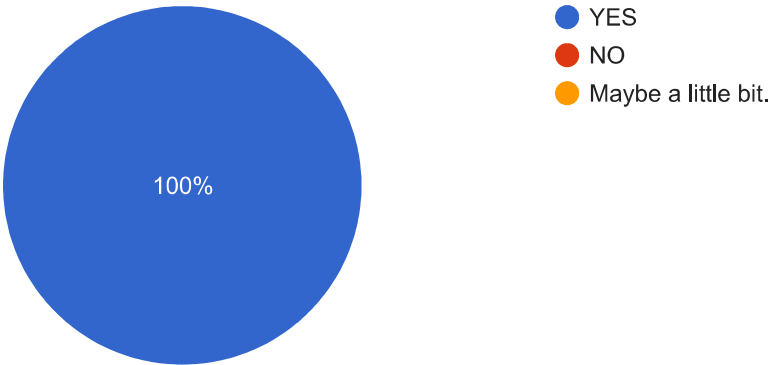
Do you think you know now what the aims of Erasmus+ Programmes are?

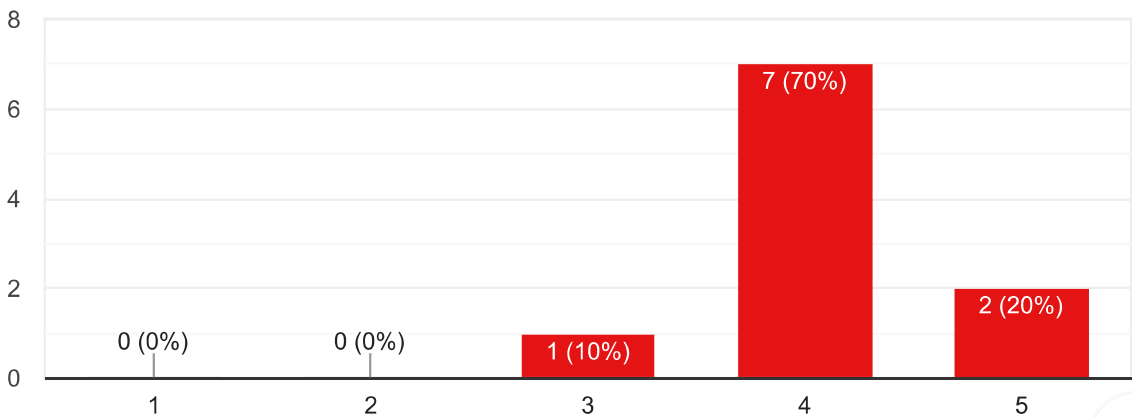
Do you think Erasmus+ Projects help to unify Europe on a personal level?

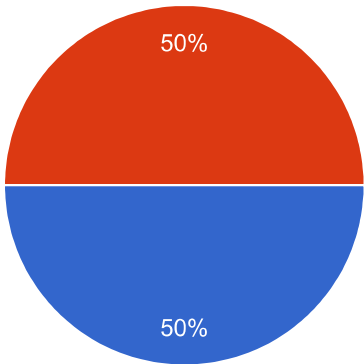
How would you rate your self-confidence to communicate in English after the project?

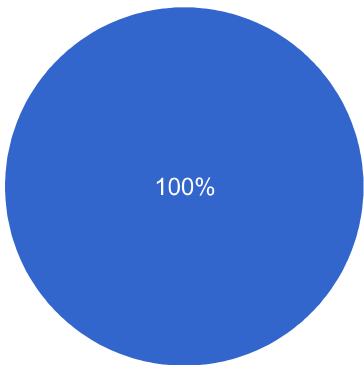

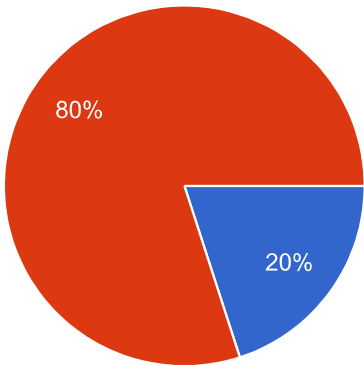

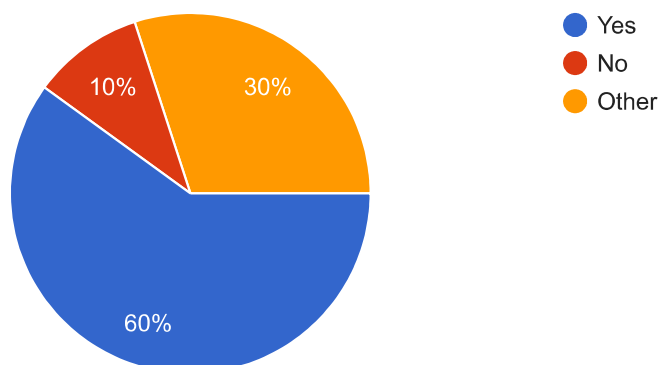

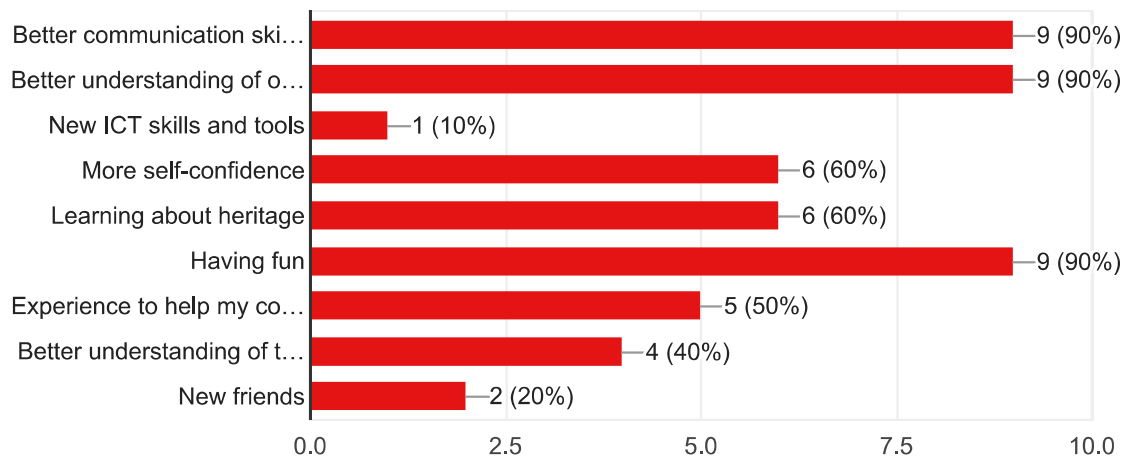

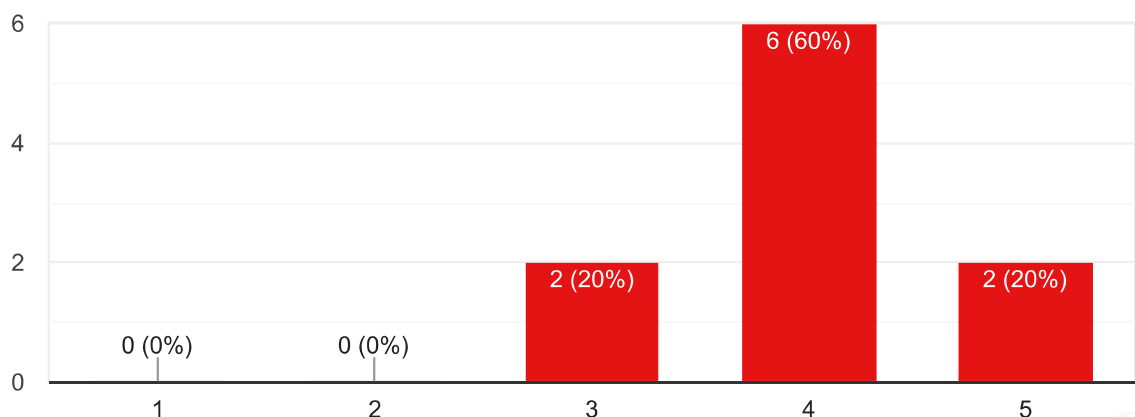
