Customer: I will pay the overweight fee. How much is it?

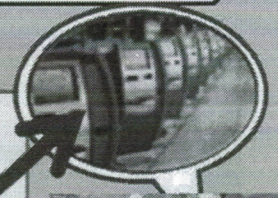
Clerk: It is \$50. If you pre-pay over the web it is cheaper.

That's all for now.

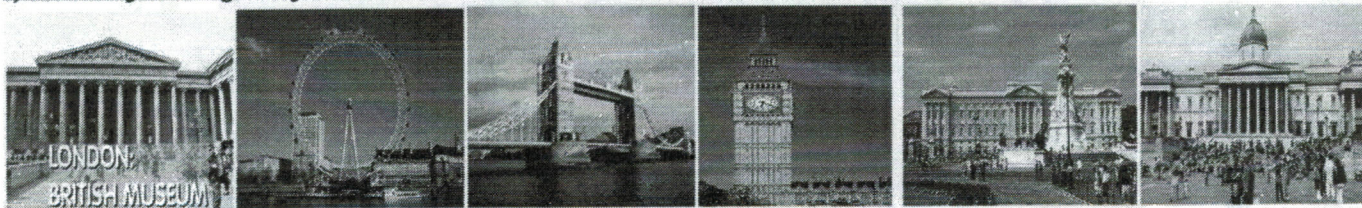
