CHILDREN'S RIGHTS

World Children's Rights Day is celebrated on November 20 each year. The date chosen coincides with the day on which the UN General Assembly adopted the **Declaration of the Rights of the** Child, in 1959, and the Convention on the Rights of the Child, in 1989.



THE 10 FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS OF CHILDREN

1. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO PLAY

All children have the right to play and have fun.

2. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO FOOD

All children have the right to food and adequate nutrition.

3. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO HAVE A HOME

All children have the right to have a home, where they can protect themselves from the cold and where they can live with their family. In addition to being a protected place, it must be a home where the child can live with understanding, tolerance, friendship, love and protection.

4. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO HEALTH

It is one of the fundamental rights that every child should have access to.

The right to health is a compendium of physical, mental and social well-being, and even more so in children, who are more vulnerable to disease.

5. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO EDUCATION

All children have the right to education, regardless of gender, religion, nationality and any other condition. The state must do everything possible to ensure children's access to education.

6. THE RIGHT TO LIFE OF CHILDREN AND TO HAVE A FAMILY

The child, for the full the development of his personality, needs love and understanding. Growing up under the responsibility of their parents and in an atmosphere of affection and moral and material security.

7. RIGHT TO HAVE A NATIONALITY

From birth, the child has the right to have a name and a surname. All children must be registered immediately after their birth, has parents are required to inform the baby's name, surname and date of birth.

8. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO EQUALITY


The right of children to equality, without distinction of race, religion or nationality. This is to ensure that all children are treated equally, regardless of their origin and whether they are in the country they are in, or have any skin color.

9. CHILDREN'S RIGHT TO EXPRESS THEIR OPINION bambino The Convention on the Rights of the Child recognizes in Articles 12 and 13 the right of children to express their opinion and their freedom of expression. Because children should rispettato express opinions freely just like adults. 10. CHILDREN'S RIGHT NOT TO WORK CHE The child must be protected from all forms of diritti neglect, cruelty and exploitation. He will not be dei subject to any type of trafficking and the child should not be allowed to work before an appropriate minimum age.
