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1. GEOGRAPHIC AREA

The ring does not always bear gems, and can be smooth, curved or otherwise, depending on the designer. The rings can be made in different types of metals. The most requested ones are made in gold or silver. The wedding ring, also called wedding ring, is a normally smooth ring in which, and in the inner part, the names of those who get married are engraved. This ring is usually made in gold, being the purity of 18 carat gold in Spain, 22 or 24 in the Arab countries and lesser in other countries like Germany.

2. CRAFT CHARACTERISTIQUES

- Below we will detail the most outstanding characteristics of these metals.

Fine silver must be at least 99.99% pure silver. It is a white, shiny and very malleable metal, although harder than gold. For jewellery pieces, it is alloyed with small amounts of copper to make it hard and resistant to wear.

Sterling silver is 925 thousandths silver, which contains 92.5% of fine silver, and the rest is mainly copper, although sometimes other trace metals appear. Sterling silver jewelry has a contrast, made with a punch, with the mark "925".

3. TECNIQUE

Techniques for the elaboration of jewellery:

This way when talking about the elaboration of jewels you can find different techniques to follow for the manufacture of the same ones. Each one of these techniques allows the jeweler to keep control of the work he is doing.

For the manufacture of a piece of jewelry, certain fundamental aspects must be taken into account. It is necessary to determine the design and thus to be able to know the materials more adapted for this elaboration. The manpower and the time that will take the elaboration of the piece of jewelry.

Casting: is the process in which the solid metal is transformed into a liquid. Noble metals such as silver are ideal for making jewelry because of their characteristics. These characteristics are the following:

1.1 Malleability: this property allows the metal to be struck or rolled.

1.2 Ductility: means that it can be stretched.

4. MATERIALS

- Valuable materials such as precious stones and coins were used, which were usually placed in combination with precious metals in their pure state or in the form of alloys, since these exist of almost all known metals
- Bronze, for example, was commonly used in Roman times. Modern fine jewelry includes gold, platinum, palladium, titanium, or silver. Most jewelry made in America and Europe is made with a gold alloy

5. HISTORY


