

JANE GOODALL

Goodall was born in London, United Kingdom in 1934. She is an English primatologist and anthropologist. Considered to be the world's foremost expert on chimpanzees,

Goodall is best known for her 60-year study of social and family interactions of wild chimpanzees since she first went to Gombe Stream National Park in Tanzania in 1960.

Early years

When she was only one year old, her father gave her a funny soft chimpanzee that everyone thought was a very ugly toy and for her it was worth a fortune. She loved to read books about monkeys and her favorite character was Jane Porter, the daughter of the scientist who organized the jungle expedition.



She was twenty-three years old when she first went to Mumbai, Kenya, and then to Africa. Her job was to study the behavior of a chimpanzee to whom she often came up with names. She was impressed by their incredible skills as well as their ability to express love and compassion for each other but also anger.

She started accepting young students to her camp to continue her work, so in 1977 he founded the Jane Goodall Institute, which still works to study and protect chimpanzees.
