


Elbląg Canal is 83 km long. There are hydro-technical devices which have been operated since 1860. Elbląg Canal is the most unique attraction in the whole world because you can travel by the ship using five ramps (where a cart moves the ship over land on rails, driven by the force of flowing water).







Old Town Hall

Is one of the most beautiful, newly established buildings in Elbląg. It is a symbol of the old town of Elbląg. Currently, it serves as the place of representation and promotion of the heritage of the city and the region. The Old Town Hall was rebuilt in the medieval walls in 2011.







St. Nicolas Cathedral


Is one of the oldest sacred buildings in Elbląg.
It has been rebuilt several times: after a great fire
in April 1777 and also after the Second World War.
Next to the cathedral there is a statue of John Paul II.
It was founded in order to celebrate the Pope's visit
to Elbląg, which took place in 1999.










The Arts Center - El Gallery is located in the former Dominican church. The church has, so far, been reconstructed several times. The means of payment for the renovation of the Gallery were raised from the European Union. Now it is a combination of contemporary glass with the gothic elements. The offer of the Gallery is very diverse: typical exhibitions, performances, concerts, festivals and workshops.







The moment commemorates the figure of the legendary heroic bakery apprentice who saved the city from the invaders. Currently, the Baker Boy is one of the symbols of the city.








The Old Town

Of Elbląg is a place that every tourist should visit. The reconstruction of the Old Town has been underway for over a dozen years. Tenement houses refer to the old style. Numerous cafés, pubs and pizzerias are waiting for tourists in the Old Town. There are many tourist attractions like Gothic buildings: St. Nicholas Cathedral and Art Center - El Gallery.









The Market Gate is one of the most characteristic and recognizable monuments of Elbląg. The 14th-century building was in the past a fragment of defunct walls of the city. The gate, like the Old Town of Elbląg, suffered heavily during the Second World War.
