## Topic: How to edit a recipe? - 2 lesson hours

Educational goals: To train the skills of observation, analysis and editing of a recipe as a written expression.

Forms of work: individual or group work.

## LESSON ONE

1. Students receive 2 recipes to read: for lemon ice cream and strawberries in gooseberry jelly.
2. Students answer questions:

- What should a recipe contain?
- What parts does it consist of?
- How to construct sentences (pay attention to the form of verbs)?

3. Students receive additional worksheets with the story and the instruction:

Read the story and write a recipe for biscuits. Remember about the list of ingredients and the correct form of the verbs. (group work)
4. Reading and discussing recipes.
5. Providing and discussing homework:

Bring sample recipes from newspapers or cookbooks.

## LESSON TWO

1. Children present the recipes.
2. A short film about the selected recipe.
3. Presenting, discussing and gluing criteria into notebooks.
4. Writing own rules by the students.
5. Children check the works of their friends according to criteria.
6. Explanation of homework:

Write a recipe for dumplings according to the established criteria.
