The name Dublin comes from two Gaelic words, *dubh* (black) and *linn* (pool) in reference to the dark waters of the river which flows through the city. The name was given to the city in the 9th century. It has changed in the last centuries. Today, people prefer to call their city *Baile Átha Cliath*, which means "town of the hurdle ford" because of a great number of hurdles built up across the river.

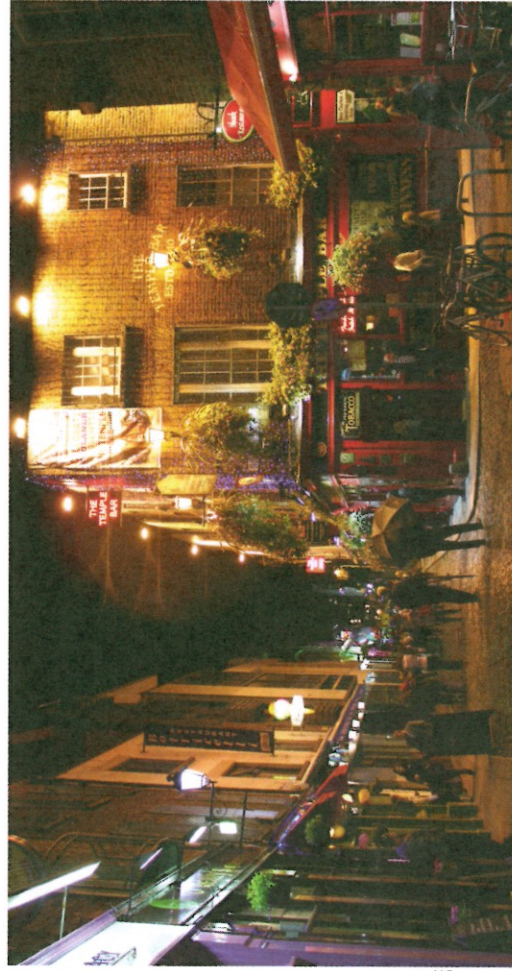

The day involves a **regan** of cultural activities, including *Ulysses* readings and dramatizations. Enthusiasts often dress in Edwardian **muscote** and retrace Bloom's route around Dublin. Some even go as far as holding **tharanom** readings of the entire novel, some lasting up to 36 **rusho**
