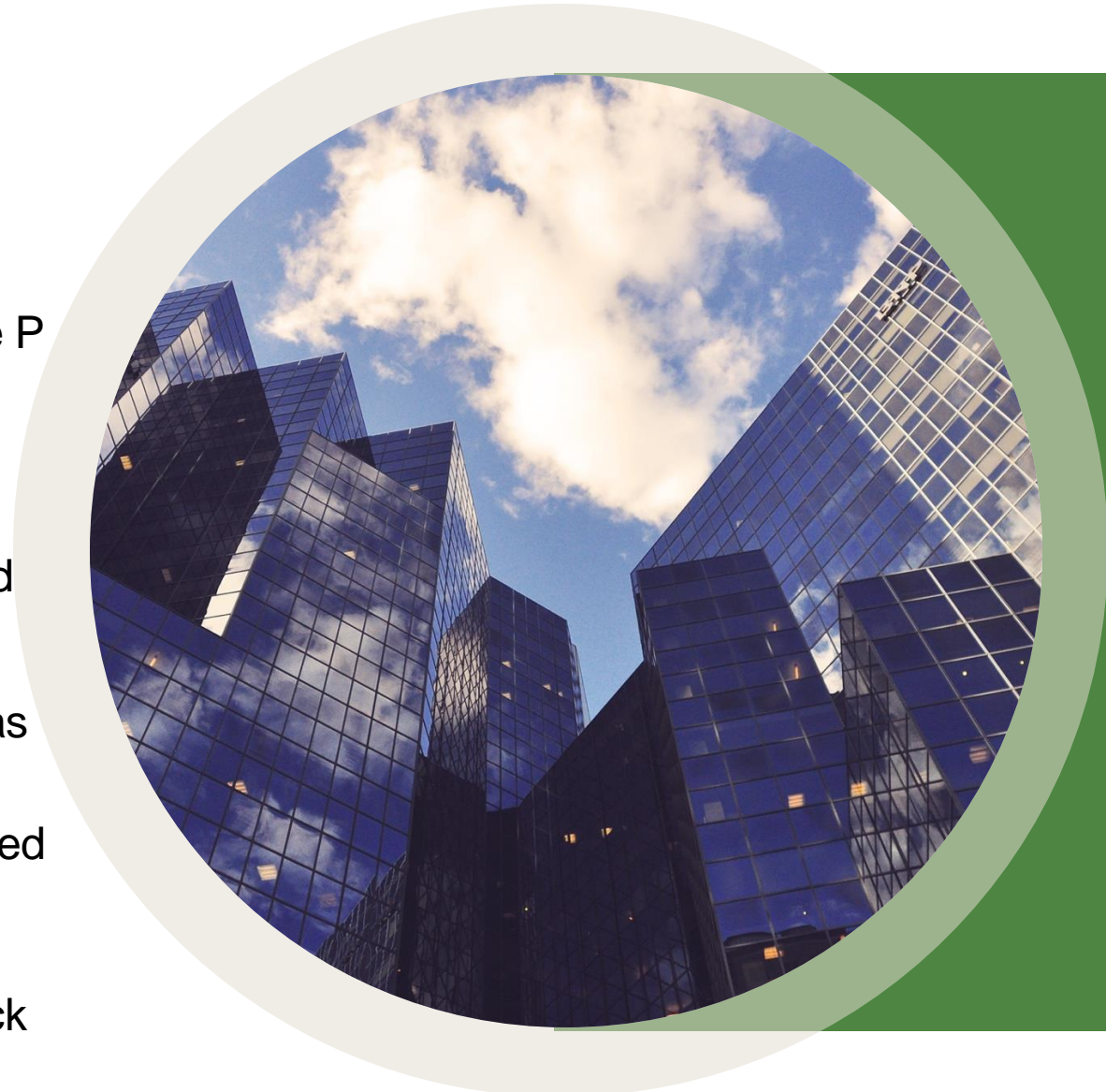

- What do you think about this activity? (here the supervisor teacher can ask questions to help them reflect on and assess the activity)

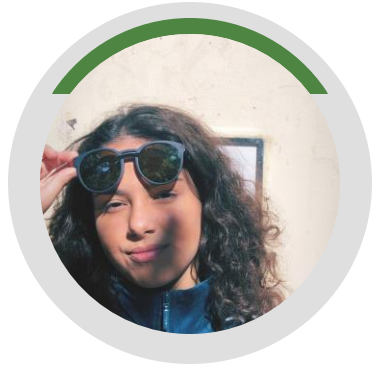


- Our strategies were different, because we all had our own strategy. For example some of made transactions everyday while others played two or three times in a week. Also some invested a lot money, some others played it safe.

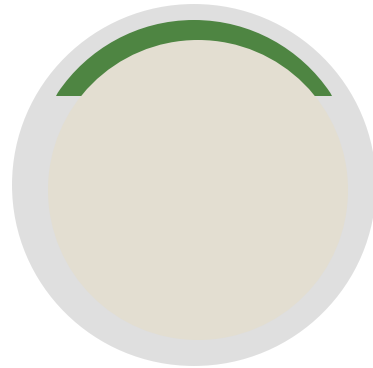

Im from Latvia and Im still going thru highschool, where I just want to get much as I can the experience, when Im graduate the school.



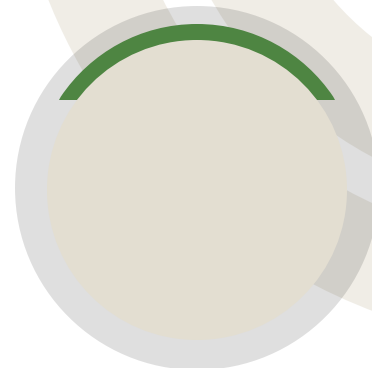
MARIA ANAGNOSTOPOULOU

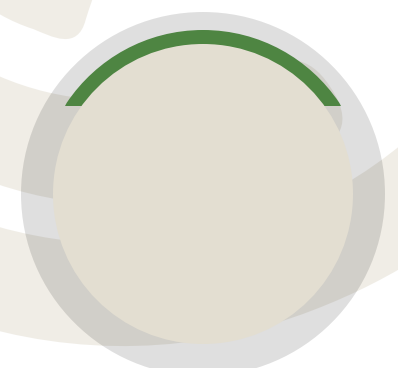
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
