


The town of Sliven is situated 300 km east of Bulgaria's capital Sofia and 100 km from The Black Sea.







Sliven has 100 000 inhabitants. It has long-lived traditions in textiles, machinebuilding, glassmaking, and the technical and food industries.








Sliven is situated at the foot of a rocky massif "The Blue Stones".

Nestinarstvo is a barefoot


Nestinarstvo

A winter tradition that takes place from January to March all around the country, breaking the silence with the loud jingling of hundreds of heavy bells. The ritual requires all participants to be dressed up like furry monsters in order to scare the evil spirits away and help spring arrive on time.

Every year on 1st of March, Bulgarian people celebrate a centuries-old tradition called the day of Granny Marta. On that day Bulgarians exchange and wear the so-called "Martenitsas" – decorative pieces of red and white twisted threads, symbolising health and happiness and a lucky charm against evil spirits. The Martenitsas are given away to friends, family and colleagues and are worn around the wrist or on clothes.
