HISTORY: WORLD HISTOY, WHAT DO I KNOW?

1. INFORMATION:

a. Date: April 8th 2016
b. Level: 15-16 yr olds
c. Subject: History

d. Theme: World History, what do I know?

e. Teacher: S. van Harten

2. AIMS/GOALS

a. Know and understand key events in World History

b. Understand chronology of events in World History

3. COMPETENCES/SKILLS (Which competences/skills will you develop in this unit)

- a. Understand cause-effect relationship between events
- b. Chronology of events
- c. Work together groups: brainstorm ideas, add to each others' ideas
- d. Presenting skills: present your findings, explain them in logical summary

4. METHODOLOGY

a. Type of lesson:

Work in groups, brainstorm, add information, present findings

b. Type of interaction (organization in classroom):

Groups, posters with events from world history are passed around for students to brainstorm and comment on.

c. Teaching aids: (like digital board, pc's ...)

Paper, pen, computer/devices with internet access, projector, cell phones

5. TEACHING:

a. Contents:

World history

b. Activities:

Group discussions, group presentation, if time: Kahoot-quiz



6. EVALUATION:

- **b.** Individual: performance in the group discussions and presentation
- c. Group evaluation: group presentation about one of the posters
- Students are put in groups of 4
- Each group gets A3-poster with an event from World History on it
- With their group they brainstorm about what they know about this event and write it on the poster:
 - Who, what, when, where, why, causes, results/effects/consequences
- After 5 min the posters all move up one group. Each group gets a new poster/event. They add information, comment on what is already on there.
- Repeat until first poster is back at original group. This group looks at all the comments on the poster and
 - Highlights the 5 most important comments/statements/info
 - o Crosses out the 5 most irrelevant comments/statements/info
- Groups (all together) decide what the correct order of all the events/posters is.
- Each group presents the poster they started with: explain
 - what the event is
 - o when it was
 - what happened
 - why it is important in history
 - EVERYBODY SPEAKS!!

When you get your first poster back:


- Highlight 5 most important comments

Step 3

Every 5 minutes you wil get a new poster. Do the same thing: write down what you know, add information.

Step 5

With all groups, you now have to put all posters in the correct chronological order of history. Remember which poster was yours!

Step 6

Each group presents their poster. Explain what happened, why, who was involved, where, what were the causes and consequences, why is it important for history, etc. YOU ALL HAVE TO SPEAK!!

Step 7

Applause!! Good job!
