How was the Jasenovac concentration camp organised? Was it an undivided camp or a system of camps?

→ 3m high wall around the camp.
 → Two rows of BW around the camp.
 → Wooden bunkers, a constructed observation towers, and posts.
 → people were kept in side barracks.
 → People were treated as 'jewels, seths' remains.
 → Guards = ~~Ustashe~~ Ustashe Croatian police.

→ Two meals per day: before labour & after.
 Look for photographs of the camp in the museum and in the database and describe what the camp looked like.

→ There were a group a camp complexes part
 in Jadovo (III Camps).
 → Women & men were separated
 → The tunnel of death, beneath the camp = at Belovar

- Why did the Ustasha authorities want to collect all available barbed wire? 1941

Because it was used to secure the walls in its upper side. That made it possible for the prisoners to escape.

- How does reading this notice make you feel?
