Analysis of the questionnaire results

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1) Do students councils help protecting students' rights at school?

• The majority of students (97%) believe that students councils help protecting students rights at school.

2) Do student councils help the students express their opinion about several matters of school life?

• The majority of students (90%) agreed that students councils help the students express their opinion about several matters of school life.

3) Do you agree that student councils should have more power at school?

• About 50% of the students agreed that student councils should have more power at school, while a 20% disagreed.

4) Are you satisfied by the results and the way that the students' councils worked last year?

• The student councils should improve the way they work: Only 42% of the students are satisfied by the last year councils

5) How would you feel if there was suddenly taken a decision about cancelling student's councils at schools?

• The majority of students (84%) would feel angry, while only 16% wouldn't feel angry at all.

6) How would you react if students councils wouldn't work in a right and fair way?

• Most of the students (35%) voted for "I would ask for meeting with my classmates" and a small percentage (3%) voted for "I wouldn't care at all".

7) <u>Do the teachers of your school help you understand</u> the value and the responsibilities of the students councils?

• Most of the students (70%) think that teachers help us somewhat but another small percentage (6%) think that they don't help them at all.

8) According to your experience for which of the following topics the students councils have responsibility?

- The most popular answers were:
 - o for students rights at school (71%)
 - o for organization of school events (61%)
 - o for students responsibilities at school (52%)
 - conversation among teachers and students for solving problems (52%)
- while the least popular answer was
 - o for bad behavior of teachers or head teacher (16%).
