



The Lamego Museum

The Lamego Museum is housed in the old Episcopal Palace, rebuilt in the

18th century by the Bishop Manuel de Vasconcelos Pereira.

Amongst other exhibits, in this museum you can see:

- the paintings of Vasco Fernandes, known as Grão Vasco;
- the Flemish tapestries (There is a tapestry alluding to the Judgement in Paradise, entitled the Temple of Latone, illustrated with mythological episodes relating to the goddess Latone and four tapestries telling the story of Oedipus, the most tragic episode in Greek mythology.)
- Portuguese and Indo-Portuguese furniture, various ceramic pieces, including some seventeenth-century tile panels, gold and silver jewellery, and a rich collection of religious vestments.
