

A closer look at Tenerife

After two days at school we will experience a destination with its own exclusive charm thanks to its diversity, weather, authenticity and volcanic essence. Most of Tenerife's tourist activity takes place in three areas:

The **South**, renowned for the wonderful sandy beaches lining much of its coastline. Its permanently pleasant weather and sunshine all year round keep the waters warm, so it is a great place for water sports and for the variety of leisure activities as we will see during our visit.

The **Metropolitan Area**, the heart of Tenerife's bustling life. Santa Cruz and La Laguna provide together many of the cultural, shopping and leisure options as well as boasting a wealth of historic and architectural heritage, museums, parks and squares. We will visit La Laguna, the only city on the Canary Islands which was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1999. It combines the essence of a majestic Canarian city with the American colonial spirit, featuring wide pedestrian streets framed by buildings that date back to several centuries.

The **North**, ranging from the valley of La Orotava to Isla Baja offers not only stunning landscapes, such as the Mount Teide standing proudly on one side and the Atlantic ocean on the other, but also Tenerife's most genuine gastronomy and hidden corners that we will see during our visit to Tajinaste wine-cellar. The volcanic earth of the Island bestows unique nuances and character to our wines. Amongst the white grape varieties, the most noteworthy is Malvasia, not to be found elsewhere in Spain. This particularly aromatic berry and one of the oldest known varieties was used in the past to make the Canarian wines that were so popular and loved in Europe, even by such prestigious figures as William Shakespeare and Walter Scott, both of whom included references to the Island's wines in their work.

Living the volcanic experience

The Island's volcanoes represent so much more than just Mount Teide. From beaches to ravines, lava flows through the very veins of Tenerife, a spectacular result of its volcanic birth. To enable you to explore and fully enjoy this aspect of the Island, we've picked out plenty of activities which best showcase Tenerife's volcanic attractions: from visits to a wine cellar offering produce of which colours and flavours reflect the Island's magmatic nature to a kite-, wind- & paddle-surfing watch and a water park to immerse yourself in blue landscapes, an exhibit centre with a selection of indigenous or endemic flora (including aloe vera and banana plantations) to explore a variety of natural beauty spots, a sample of our dishes made from local produce such as 'papas arrugadas' (*wrinkled potatoes*) with 'mojos' (*sauces*), 'gofio' (*toasted corn meal*), cheese, fish and honey, a journey to the Centre of the Earth on a guided walk for a close-up view of craters, volcanic cones and vents...

PLEASE NOTE:

1. The school is located in the South of Tenerife, for those traveling to the North it takes 1h15min to get to Los Cristianos.
2. Though the fabulous average **temperature** round of 23°C we visit **Mt. Teide**, where the weather is very chilly with a cold wind. Take a light waterproof, coat and hat, along with at least a good pair of trainers as the upper path is quite rocky.
3. For the **Water Park** be sure to take a sporty design swimwear that is less likely to come undone. Pavements can get extremely hot, do not forget your flip-flops and water resistant sunscreen.
