CHRISTMAS IN GREECE

At Christmas children in Greece don't go to school from December 23rd to January 7th. Most towns are decorated with Christmas trees, bright lights, bells, angels and other Christmassy objects. You will often see boats decorated with many sparkling lights, rather than the traditional Christmas trees. In the country's big cities there are music concerts, theatrical performances and other cultural events. In the large squares there are little elf houses that sell candy and children can take part in a number of activities. The shops are decorated with all the usual Christmas ornaments. On New Year's Eve there are fireworks and concerts in the big cities. Children usually get presents on the 1st January. On Christmas Eve and New year's Eve, they go from house to house singing the carols, with the accompaniment of a triangle, and people give them money. People go to church very early on Christmas morning for the religious service. On January 6th young people dive into really cold lakes, rivers and the sea and try to find a cross which has been blessed by a priest and thrown into the water. The person who gets the cross first is meant to have good luck during the coming year. This is also known as "The Blessing of the Waters" or Epiphany.

Christmas food in Greece

In the past years, Christmas turkey has become very popular as the main dish of the holiday. Traditionally, the main course of Christmas dinner in Greece is roast pork, with a variety of side delicacies. Melomakarona and kourabiedes are the two varieties of Christmas and New Year's cookies in Greece. Vasilopita is a cake that is eaten on New Year's Day and has a coin in it. The person who has the coin in his piece, will have luck for the rest of the year.
