— "I'd run away" says Hodja.

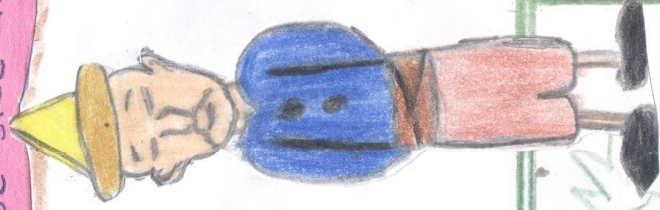
— "The bear would run faster and catch you, then what?" says the man.

— "I'd climb a tree." says Hodja.

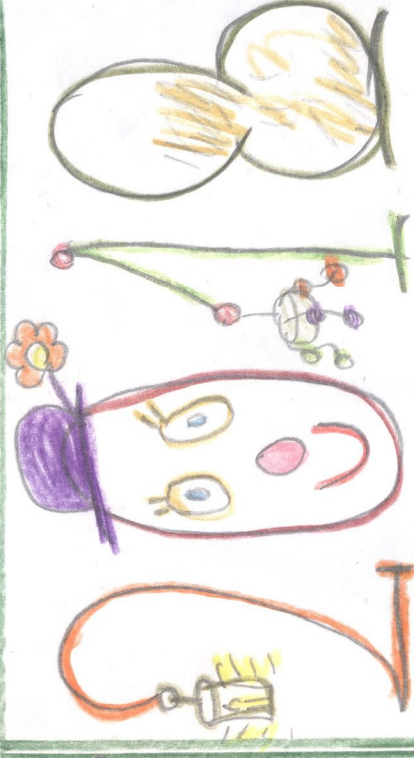
— "So would the bear, then what?" asks the man.

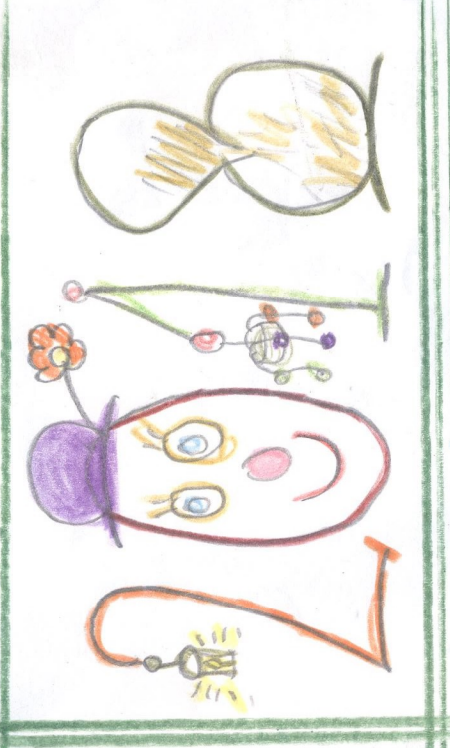
