








Rate the initial informative talk about the Erasmus+ program prior to mobility  ${\it 15\, respuestas}$ 







Evaluate the process of selection and evaluation of students in the Erasmus+ project 15 respuestas




Values the involvement of the team of teachers in charge of the IES Los Cerros  $\ensuremath{^{15}\text{respuestas}}$ 



Evaluate the management of information through the Google Classroom platform  $\ensuremath{^{15}\,\mathrm{respuestas}}$ 




Values the involvement and help of the person(s) in the mobility destination  $\ensuremath{^{15}}\xspace$  respuestas






Values the involvement and help of the person(s) from IES Los Cerros during the mobility  $^{15}\,\mathrm{respuestas}$ 




#### Assess the destination school of your mobility



## Evaluate the development of your intellectual abilities in mobility 15 respuestas




## Evaluate the development of your communication skills in the foreign language ${\it 15}\,{\it respuestas}$






Assess the development of your social skills during/after mobility  ${\it 15\, respuestas}$ 






### Evaluate the coordinating teachers of IES Los Cerros during the mobility $\,$


#### Evaluate teachers at the mobility destination school







Evaluate the usefulness of the Flipped Classroom model in your daily classes 15 respuestas

- I have improved in some subjects since now I have more interest to see how they are in other countries
- I have not improved but not because of the project
- First of all, part of the learning of the language of the country itself in this case Italy, social and communicative improvement with English. Discovery of both cultures, and make new links for the future. In addition, the organization and maturity you develop and then continue with your personal training side.
- Carrying out this project has helped me expand my cultural portfolio in my life.
- The mobility in which I participated did not specifically deal with any aspect applicable
  to my motivation as a student or to improving my academic results, since this mobility
  had a more cultural objective.
- The improvement in the use of the foreign language is noticeable and my interest in it has been fostered.
- I have had to apply myself more to get the exchanges
- I have improved in social skills

Proposals for improvement related to Erasmus mobilities.

- More activities with foreigners there
- Fewer activities and more free time to spend with family and friends
- Increase the duration of projects (long-term mobilities go from 1 week to 2 weeks)
- In the case of long-term mobility, improvement of the organization with the
  mechanization of the Erasmus carried out, in this case "Flipped Classroom", and
  improvement of communication so as not to miss class during the time that you travel
  and this involves the teaching staff of the school that trip, give something of missed
  class or more narrowing between the student body.
- You could try to change the hours of flights and trips. Otherwise, all good.
- I am satisfied with the way they have been done.

Proposals for improvement related to mobility management.

- Facilitate exams for students who participate in mobility, since they return to Spain and many exams await them
- There should be more long-term mobilities
- Coordination with the school should be better organized while we are in a mobility, since it is hard to come back and have 7 exams in the same week and without the possibility of studying in advance (since you are in a mobility). It would also be convenient to organize the meetings with the students in a time slot that was not recess.
- That there is more communication between countries

Problems and anecdotes that you have had during mobility

Problems with colleagues who went to the mobility of Spain and many anecdotes



- My correspondent ignored me and did not speak to me when I tried to bring up a topic of conversation
- I thought I had left my ID on the plane and in the end I had it
- (Long-term trip) The biggest problem has been communication with the class, both teachers and students of the center to which we traveled. Because they did not know how to speak English, to establish a minimum conversation and that made the environment difficult and generated many problems.
- Unfortunately, the "explosion" of the pandemic caused by SARS-Cov-2 during our mobility turned everything upside down and decimated the planned activities.
   However, the organizing faculty did everything possible for us to learn and enrich ourselves culturally as much as possible.
- I had a couple of problems with money and currency exchange at the airport on the return trip, but nothing major.
- The teacher in charge of the project at the mobility destination was on sick leave and our activities at the site were not well managed.
- No problems many anecdotes with the family from Poland and activities done in Spain
- An anecdote was when several boys and girls came to my house and we exchanged traditional music and expressions from all cultures.

However, there are well-known things that can be improved and that can be difficult for people who travel, such as the issue of communication between any teacher of the school to which you travel, and the foreign student.
