Compost

Conxi said that in Catalonia there is a problem with making compost because there are not a lot of trees so it is difficult to find leaves. Annette suggested making the compost in a box using things found in the kitchen and buying hay to add in. Conxi will discuss this with the team and find a solution. A presentation about compost-making will be brought to The Canary Islands.

Colleagues in The Canary Islands also had problems with compost making but are willing to give it a try. Tracy Park suggested using vegetable peelings and leaves and keeping it in a warm place.

Recipe Books

There are to be a maximum of 5 recipes per country. Germany and England have sent 3 recipes to Conxi. The Canary Islands and Catalonia have provided 5 each. England will bring 2 more recipes to the next meeting in Gran Canaria. Conxi will bring an example of the recipe book. All recipes are to be in English. Conxi mentioned each country possibly being given 25 books each.

Photographs

The team from The Canary Islands have made a powerpoint of their photographs. Conxi would like an exhibition of the work produced in the project in each country. There will be a compilation of photographs made and each country can choose their own system to exhibit them.

Presentations are on Etwinning and can be used for exhibition.

All photographic presentations are to be taken to The Canary Islands in April. The final meeting is in Catalonia in June. The compilation of photos will be ready for this final meeting and teams can visit the Catalonian exhibition.

Garden concepts

Please bring to Grand Canaria if possible.

The German team want to write a concept for the garden to include other classes in the ongoing development – writing rules, etc. This may not be finished for Grand Canaria in April.

The English team will speak to Steve O'Mara about putting together a concept of the development and usage of our garden (e.g. like our Sensory Room booklet).

Pear tree and Spring-time in the garden

All teams are also to bring a presentation entitled 'Our garden in Spring' to Grand Canaria in April. This is to include an update on the pear tree and what seeds are planted/what is growing.

There is also to be a pear tree update in June.

Final Report

The final report is to be in English and will be discussed in Catalonia in June. Also to be discussed is how the stories about the Magic Scarecrow will be used in classrooms. Annette pointed out that most may be too simplistic for the children in Germany but possibly could be used for 1:1 work. The story written by the German team needs to be told when the herbs in the story are actually growing. The other stories will be probably be used with the youngest children.

Final presentations will be given in Catalonia (Lleida) and all work must be finished before arrival. There will be a celebration of the project.
